# **Have your say on further improvements to services**

We are inviting disabled people, families, whānau and carers to help shape further improvements to disability support services.

We want to improve services in key areas that the disability community has told us matter most to them.

## **We are building on what you've already told us**

Your feedback has already shaped some important changes.

Over the past two years, we have listened to the disability community and taken action to stabilise the disability support system.

This has made access to DSS-funded supports more fair, consistent and sustainable, while restoring more choice and control for people who use flexible funding.

We know there is more to do.

You have told us what the issues are—now we want to know what good looks like for you.

Your input will help shape the next improvements to services and supports.

## Seeking community input to improve key areas

We are asking for your input on some key areas:

- **Outcomes that matter**—being clearer about the difference that DSS-funded supports make in disabled people's everyday lives and safety.
- **Earlier, proactive and planned support**—planning the right support at the right time as people's needs change over time.
- **Feedback and complaints**—making it easier to speak up about the services of DSS providers.
- **Better options for carer respite**—improving options for respite so it is easier for carers to take a break.
- **More choice and control in services**—offering more flexibility in the supports we fund, outside of flexible funding.
- **Improved information and advice**—making it easier to get information and access DSS supports and services.

- **Closes** at 5pm Friday, 31 July 2026

## How to have your say

From 8 June to 31 July, you can take part in the consultation in a way that works for you:

- Complete an online survey. You can answer as many or as few questions as you like.
- Make a written or recorded submission—you can find the questions in the full discussion document, and the summary.
- Join an online or in-person workshop. There are many dates to choose from.
